

Eastminster recently acquired an automated external defribrillator (AED) and updated our safety/emergency policy. These actions depend on all of us knowing what to do and how to do it if an emergency occurs. To that end, Eastminster will host a class to teach or refresh your ability to use CPR and an AED. The class will be taught by Olivia Skowronek, East Lansing Fire Department, Safety Training Officer and an additional ELFD instructor.

A light lunch will be provided after worship before the training begins. The church is paying for the training; if you want official certification (a card) you will need to pay \$19. Enrollment is limited to 12 people. Sign up on the list in narthex or by contacting the church office.
