

The novel takes place in the Great Lakes region before and after a swine flu pandemic, known as the "Georgia Flu," has devastated the world, killing most of the population.



With the coming of Epiphany, we again celebrate our tradition of "star words." On the day that we remember the star that led the magi to Jesus, we pass out paper stars with a printed word. This is a spiritual practice that invites you to receive a word as a gift that can guide, inspire, or challenge you in the coming year. Keep your star someplace where you will see it throughout the coming year. Below are some prompts to help you begin thinking about your word.

- What are your initial thoughts about the word?
- What is the definition of your word?
- What are the different forms your word can take? How do the different forms change its meaning?
- What synonyms of your word come to mind? How do they help to shape your understanding of your word?
- What scripture passage(s) or stories does your word bring to mind? If you need some help, try going to biblegatway.com or use a Bible concordance to look up passages.
