who pours out living water on all who thirst.



Lectio Divina

An ancient Christian prayer practice, *lectio divina* or "divine reading" is a way of being in prayer as one reads scripture. We read with open ears and hearts to hear what the Spirit may be speaking to us at this moment.

- 1. **Read** the scripture slowly. Listen for a key phrase or word that jumps out to you.
- 2. **Reflect** on that word or phrase. As you read the scripture passage again reflect on that word or phrase that stuck out to you. Try not to slip into studying or analyzing the passage. Listen to what God might be saying to you through the word or phrase.
- **3. Respond** by asking "What is God's invitation to me?" in what I have read or heard. You might journal or in prayer have a conversation with God.
- **4. Rest** by sitting quietly in God's presence. Be with God. Breathe.
